

Martin Palecek is an Associate Professor of Philosophy at the University of Hradec Kralove, specializing in the philosophy of social sciences, cultural anthropology, and cognitive sciences. He earned his Ph.D. from Charles University in Prague and was a Fulbright-Masaryk Fellow at Emory University, where he collaborated with leading experts in Philosophy of Social Sciences and Cognitive Science of Religion.
