Microsocialism: round table dicussion in Pula



The final meeting of the research team and the round table *Results of the research project Microsocialism*, financed by the Croatian Science Foundation (HRZZ), were held at the Faculty of Humanities in Pula earlier this month, on April 5. After the addresses by the University's vice-rector and the Faculty's vice-dean, the research team members Chiara Bonfiglioli (online from Geneva), Anita Buhin, Tina Filipović, Magdalena Najbar-Agičić, Saša Vejzagić, Tomislav Branđolica (online from Zagreb), and the principal investigator Igor Duda talked about their approach, hypotheses, sources and the key findings of their research which shed new light on Yugoslav socialism in the 1970s and 1980s.

IOS-Jahrestagung 2023: (Re-)Ordering Eastern Europe, Regensburg, 12-13 October 2023

From the bipolar setup of the Cold-war era via a unipolar world order following the collapse of the Soviet Union, the world has moved on to yet another stage of being in flux. It is marked by constant re-negotiations and re-adjustments of centres and balances of power, as well as of security arrangements involving volatile and fragmented coalitions. The 2023 edition of the IOS Annual Conference aspires to address these ongoing changes and shifts as multiscalar processes of re-ordering Eastern Europe. 'Eastern Europe' is broadly defined as including Eastern and East-Central Europe, Southeastern Europe, the South Caucasus, and Central Asia. This vast region is of great importance for the social sciences and multidisciplinary research with area studies foci. (Read more)

Pop after Communism. The Transformation of Popular Culture after 1989/90, Berlin, 15-17 November 2023

The social changes that went along with the political upheaval of 1989/90 in the countries of state socialism were not limited to the political system, economic structures or social conditions. The late phase and the end of state socialism were marked by a far-reaching transformation of popular culture, with global cultural changes becoming an important driver of the post-communist transformation. The conference hence aims to bring together researchers in the broader field of "pop history" to examine the overarching tendencies of this fundamental socio-cultural change and the protagonists and institutions that determined it from a comparative perspective. The focus of the conference is on pop music and the entire range of pop cultural forms of expression. (Read more)

National communism in socialist federations, Prague, 14-15 September 2023

Nationalism was never alien to communism. In most socialist dictatorships, nationalism presented a welcome source of ideological legitimation, especially when communist regimes were losing their appeal to the general public. For a significant part of the communist party elite and Marxist intellectuals, nationalism was an essential part of their ideological self-identification. Many of them considered themselves heirs of 19th-century national romanticism. In multinational communist states and/or socialist federations, the complicated relations between communist ideology and nationalism were particularly noticeable. The different national communisms competed or coexisted with each other and with state-supported, supranational concepts like Czechoslovak and Soviet patriotism or Yugoslavism. The interactions between the federal structures and national communism are, therefore, particularly interesting. (Read more)

Šta stvarno znamo o Titovim partizanima, najvažnijem oružanom pokretu otpora u okupiranoj Evropi? Postoje mnogobrojna djela iz komunističkog perioda posvećena partizanskom pokretu, ali je ta literatura umnogome prevaziđena. Ova knjiga se ne bavi vojnom historijom partizana, čak iako se NOVJ redovno pojavljuje u zapisnicima i izvještajima KPJ-a i NOO-ova u vezi sa mobilizacijom novog ljudstva, snabdijevanjem hranom ili s djelatnošću vojnih sudova. Historija partizana predstavljena u ovoj knjizi je istovremeno politička i lokalna historija, usredsređena na regiju Bosanske krajine, koja otkriva političku praksu na koju se nailazi i u ostatku jugoslavenskog prostora. Činjenica da je Bosanska krajina glavno uporište partizanskog pokreta tokom Drugog svjetskog rata objašnjava njenu ulogu koja uveliko prevazilazi vlastite geografske granice. (Read More)

The French Institutes for Advanced Study Fellowship Programme offers 10-month fellowships in the seven Institutes of Aix-Marseille, Loire Valley (Orléans-Tours), Lyon, Montpellier, Nantes, Paris and Rennes. It welcomes applications from high-level international scholars to develop their innovative research projects in France. The call is open to all disciplines in the social sciences and the humanities (SSH) and all research fields. Research projects in other sciences and in arts that propose a strong interaction and dialogue with the SSH are also eligible. Scholars working in the field of contemporary political, social, economic history or related disciplines, as well scholars working in the field of digital humanities, are invited to apply for the fellowship of two weeks, one month, or two months. The visiting fellows are expected to contribute to the work of Institute, yet the scope and the essence of the contribution is negotiable and will be agreed upon on a case-to-case basis. The goal is to foster long-term institutional cooperation, to orient towards the Institute's long-term vision of international institutional cooperation in Europe and beyond, and to broaden the methodological, thematic, and geographical scope of the research conducted at the institute.
