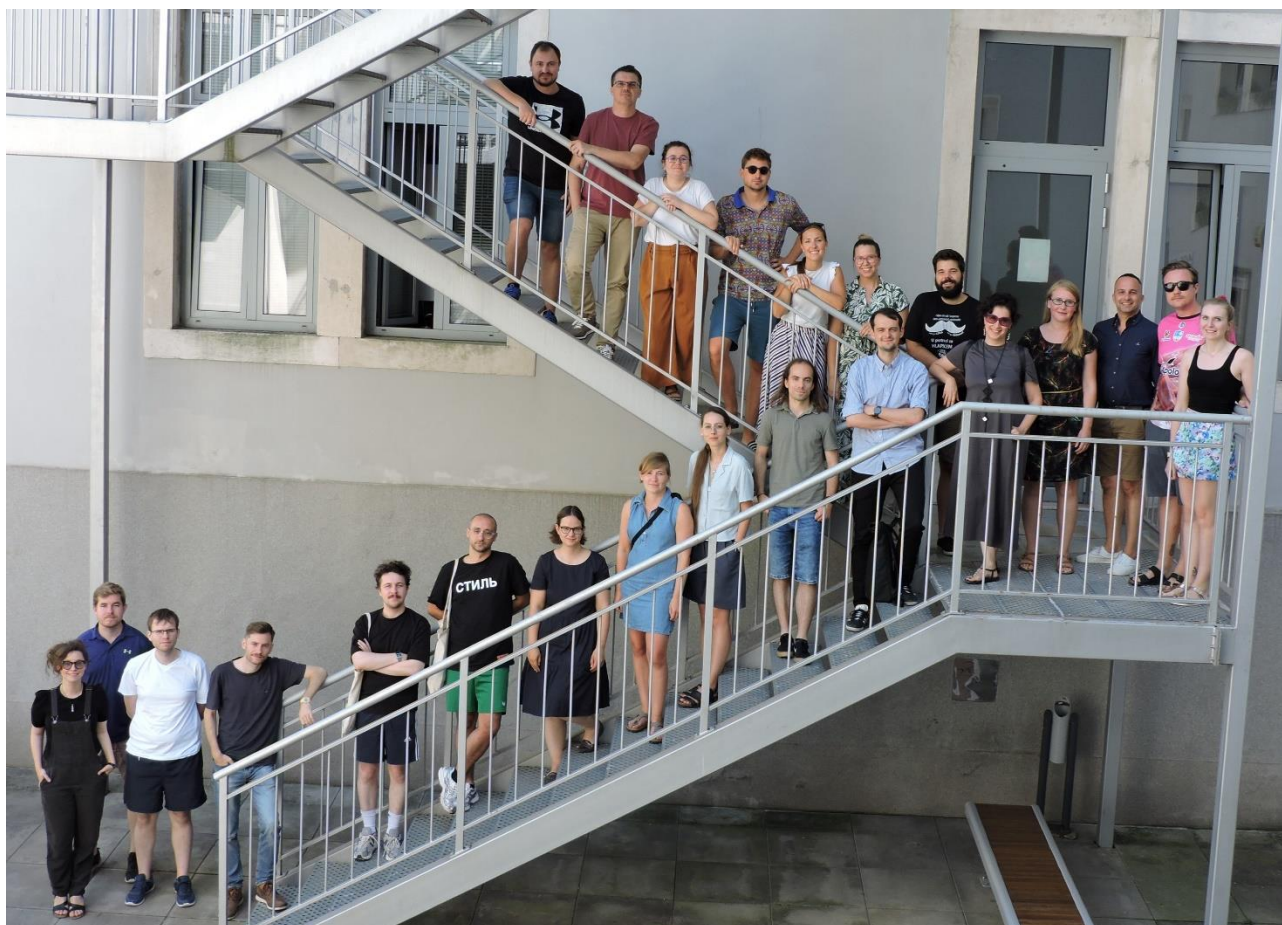

9th Doctoral Workshop held in Pula

For the ninth year in a row, from August 23 to 26, Pula hosted the Doctoral Workshop of CKPIS and the Department of History, University of Pula. This year the theme was *What Was Europe? Perception, Division and Integration, 1940s-2010s*, and it was connected to the cooperation with the network around the project *Suche nach der verlorenen Zeit – Jugoslawien und die europäische Integration*, based at the Humboldt University of Berlin and supported by DAAD. Seventeen doctoral students from the universities in Berlin, Bielefeld, Bohum, Budapest, Glasgow, Ljubljana, Munich, Potsdam, Prague, Tübingen and Zagreb took part in the workshop, as well as four keynote speakers: Radina Vučetić (University of Belgrade), Dean Vuletic (University of Luxembourg), Nemanja Radonjić (University of Belgrade) and Anita Buhin (Nova University Lisbon). The latter was also a member of the Organising Committee, together with Tina Filipović,

Sara Žerić and the head of the workshop Igor Duda. Apart from the keynotes, presentations and discussion, the programme also consisted of the visit to the Historical and Maritime Museum of Istria and the tour to some parts of the city. Screening Politics: Film Festivals, Archives and Cinematic Exhibition in the Cold War, St Andrews, 10-12 November 2023

The purpose of this event is to exchange views on current research projects in a collegial setting, and ideally create points of contact for future exchange. The workshop will focus on the “politics” of showing films, i.e., the influence of institutional actors from politics, culture and education on the circulation, canonization and preservation of films (organisations, archives, festivals, parties, ministries, universities, schools, foundations, museums, etc.). Today, peace is rarely discussed or taken seriously. At best it is seen as an irrelevant by-product of political and economic processes. In a culture of normalised violence and war against humans, animals, plants, and the planet as a whole, in a culture of endless extraction of organic and inorganic entities, of space and time, legitimated by the mindless run for profitability, peace became a decentred and delegitimated condition of existence, a nuisance and an obstacle to “freedom, democracy, progress”. Therefore, the conference especially welcomes researchers and artists to reflect on the role, prospect, and fate of peace in the 21st century in research presentations and works of art (painting, graphics, computer animation, photography, literary interventions).

Nikola Baković, *Brotherhood On The Move. Ritual Mobilities In The Second Yugoslavia (Srednja Europa: Zagreb, 2023)*

This book analyses the socio-cultural dynamics of ritual mobilities, one of the most widespread cultural frameworks through which the notion of unified national space was articulated in socialist Yugoslavia. While their federal-scale territorial dispersion outlined the spatial extent of the country, the density of its network provided the set of spatial markers that would form the cultural imaginary of Yugoslavia. On the lower scales, towns and villages engaged in translocal interactions that, in many cases, represented the gist of their Yugoslav experience. At the most intimate level of families and individuals, Yugoslavia was very often what they experienced during the traversals, whether as mobile 'guests' from afar or as 'hosting' representatives of own place. U opisu knjige se navodi: „Da mi je neko 1990. rekao da ću 2020. godine objaviti zbirku tekstova pod nazivom Jedva čekam socijalizam!, shvatio bih to kao lošu šalu. U jesen 1989, sa navršenih osamnaest godina, vreme sam provodio slušajući na radiju emisije o krahу komunističkih diktatura i ‘realnog socijalizma’ u Istočnoj Evropi. [...] A sad evo: trideset godina kasnije – 2020, hiperkapitalizam je otišao predaleko i uveren sam da moramo naći način za prevazilaženje kapitalizma, neki novi oblik socijalizma koji bi bio participativan i decentralizovan, federalan i demokratski, ekološki, nerasistički i feministički. Istorija će odlučiti da li je reč ‘socijalizam’ definitivno pohranjena i treba li je zameniti nekom drugom rečju.“ ([Read More](#))

IOS Fellowship programme, Regensburg

Within the framework of its Visiting Research Fellow Program, the IOS encourages applications from historians, economists and political scientists as well as scholars of cognate disciplines. The IOS carries out research in two major research fields: Institutionalization, De-Institutionalization, Re-Institutionalization, and Mobility(s) and Inequality(s). Together with the University of Regensburg, the IOS has established the Leibniz ScienceCampus “Europe and America in the Modern World. Frictions and Transformations of Globality since the 19th Century.” The duration of the research stay usually lasts between two and four weeks. We will consider projects that explore transatlantic interconnections and exchanges, or offer comparative perspectives on phenomena affecting (parts of) both Europe and America. Herzog Ernst Scholarships and Hiob Ludolf Fellowships, Universität Erfurt

Thanks to the generous support of the Ernst Abbe Foundation (Ernst-Abbe-Stiftung), which began funding in 2020, the Centre for Transcultural Studies is responsible for the Herzog Ernst Scholarship Programme – a close cooperation endeavor with the Gotha Research Center and the Gotha Research Library. The research focusses on the contemporary history of the Gotha collections and thus draws attention to 19th and 20th centuries topics linked to the Gotha holdings. This includes historical research on material culture and object history, history of knowledge as well as history of science, esp. of the natural sciences (e.g. zoology and botany) as well as space-oriented disciplines (e.g. geography, geology, ethnology, and statistics).
